Housing Development Hullbridge

Despite press reports that councils can now decide their own housing needs, Rochford Council, and its Conservative Administration, has decided to keep the housing targets originally imposed on it by the Labour Government and is continuing to target Hullbridge for 500 houses. Although the lobbying of your Green District Councillor, Michael Hoy, has managed to get the building programme postponed until after 2026 All the Conservative Councillors voted to continue with this policy and to build these houses on Hullbridge Green Belt.

The Green Party is opposed to building on Green Belt Land, and in particular building on farmland as it is to the west of Hullbridge. We are the only party you can trust on this and who will keep to our promises.
